Tips

Familiarize yourself with your camera's different modes. Each camera or app will be a little different.



Some phone cameras or apps will have a filter that will allow you to edit / convert a color image. **Instagram** is an app with easy to use filters and editing tools.

Search your app store for black & white camera apps that allow for direct black & white shooting.

Print it and frame it!

Supplies & Tools

- Digital Camera, Smartphone Camera, iPad (other device that can take a picture)
- Yourself or a Model (friend, relative, pet)
- A Few Interesting Environments to Capture your Subject
- Tripod or Mini Tripod (especially for shooting yourself)
- Optional Tools
 - Camera Remote (for compatible devices)

Preparation & Execution

- 1. **The Set Up.** After you have gathered your tools and talent, scout your location and set up your camera.
- 2. **Think** about how you want to frame your shot. Will your subject be featured in the left, right or center of your frame? At what distance will you capture your subject?
- 3. Use your device to take a few practice shots to fine tune your final image. When you're ready, take your main shots!
- When you're done, upload to your social media and use #urbanartsspace and #crafternoons. If your young artist is working with you, also use #artexplorations
- 5. Do it again and don't forget to title your work!
